A Year of Growth for the Bike Path and for the Friends

Phase 1B (Shining Tides) Update

We'll start off the newsletter with the question everyone is asking: **When will the Shining Tides Mile open?** The following is a statement from Town Administrator Mike Lorenco.

The Town of Mattapoisett is in negotiations concerning final construction and future bridge maintenance costs and responsibilities with the Bike Path Construction Team (Mass DOT, the contractor, and engineers.) Progress in final installation of planking and railings will proceed according to these negotiations. Unfortunately, use of the bike path is prohibited until the planking and railings are installed in conformity with the contracts and the project in its entirety is completed to the satisfaction of the Bike Path Construction Team. These negotiations proceed in earnest, and we are hopeful for a timely conclusion.

Meanwhile, the Marion Connector is currently under construction and should be completed in July. This will connect Mattapoisett's rail trail to Marion's. Marion's path is on the fiscal year 2023 budget and could go out to bid at that time.

The Half Mile Marion Connector is Almost Done!



The construction of the half mile Marion Connector began in May and is awaiting the finishing touches! This project paved the old railroad right of way from the end of Industrial Drive to the Marion town line, and includes a parking lot at the intersection of Bay Club Drive and Industrial Drive.

The Town of Marion is expected to begin construction of their bike path in 2023. When Marion's project connects to our paved half mile, riders and walkers will enjoy a car-free path and access to the Sippican Lands Trust walking trails.

The Connector project was part of a larger plan to upgrade Industrial Drive. Construction was funded using a \$110,000 grant from MassTrails, a \$95,000 grant from the Friends 2020 fundraiser, and a 1:1 match of funding from the Town of Mattapoisett (voted by the Town in 2019 and 2020.)

Again, we want to thank all who donated to and supported the completion of this very important half mile!

Completing the Path (Phase 2A and Industrial Drive)

The Friends are working with Mattapoisett's Capital Planning Committee to address present and future bike path phases in an effort to include bike path needs in the Comprehensive Capital Plan that will be presented in the 2021 Fall Special Town Meeting. Discussions will include the needs and car-free opportunities from Depot Street to the Park and Ride on North Street (Phase 2A) and Industrial Drive (the final segment of Phase 2B.) It is important for the town to fully incorporate major expenditures on permanent infrastructure like the bike path into the Capital Plan.

Supplying Needed Amenities for the Rail Trail

The Friends have voted to dedicate up to \$20,000 towards an array of amenities for the bike path, including bike racks, water stations, and informational signage. The Select Board is currently reviewing a set of safety regulations for posting.
