Six New Benches (and More to Come!)

An incredible team of volunteers (led by Regis Lavoie with Matt Dessert and brothers Andy and Evan Stackpole) installed six of the eleven purchased benches last weekend! Two were placed at the new Marion Connector (off Industrial Drive), and four are spread out between Mattapoisett Neck Road and the Fairhaven town line. These donated benches are awaiting recognition plaques.

In addition to the benches, six 5-foot bike racks have been delivered, ready for assembly and installation!

Partial Opening for Shining Tides?

The Town and MassDOT have been discussing options for Phase 1B that include a partial opening. As you all are aware, the section between Reservation Road and Goodspeed Island Road needs replacement boards for the decking installed by MassDOT. However, the section between Mattapoisett Neck Road and Reservation Road is near completion. Although we have not received confirmation from the Town, Select Board Member Jordan Collyer commented on the Facebook page Mattapoisett Life that this half-mile section could open up as early as next month. We wanted our supporters to know that we are aware of this news, but we continue to be cautious and will share more information when we hear from the Town Administrator.

Applying for Grants to Fund Phase 2A

We apologize again for the last-minute decision to withdraw our request for Community Preservation funding at Monday night's Town Meeting.

As Chairman of the Mattapoisett Bike Path Committee Steve Kelleher explained, "(We) anticipated that by now we would have some hard costs from the appraiser for Phase 2A. However, that work has not been completed. Therefore, I would like to withdraw Article 15 without prejudice until we have a more complete presentation for Town Meeting."

However, the Bike Path Committee and the Friends have prepared two federal and two state grant applications on behalf of our Town. Because of the recently passed federal Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), unprecedented amounts of funds are currently available. Our grant writers are working diligently on behalf of our Town to bring in federal infrastructure dollars to complete our bicycle/pedestrian path.

Again, we appreciate all the positive feedback we have received from our supporters!

Bikes for All Celebrates One Year!

The Friends (in partnership with MattRec) started the Bikes for All program early in 2021, and we could not be happier with its progress! Last summer, our volunteers distributed over sixty donated and gently-used refurbished bicycles to children and adults.
