

# Update for the Eastern Half of Phase 1B

While the State Department of Transportation works through the contract details with the Town, the contractors are busy installing the decking for the bridge over Reservation Beach (the section between Reservation Rd. and Goodspeed Island Rd.)

The replacement decking is half as wide and twice as deep as the earlier design, and they are secured on the underside. The railings are going up simultaneously, and the contractor has many hands on "deck" this time around, making for fast progress.

If all continues to go well, we will be enjoying the Shining Tides Mile soon. And we'll be sure to blast the newsletter horn as soon as it happens!

# Phase 2A Underway Thanks to Grant Money

Work on the path's Phase 2A pre-design study is underway using a \$120,000 MassTrails secured with the grant. Friends' \$30,000 funding match. The Friends were able to commit to this project thanks to donors like you. The Town chose PARE Corporation as the engineer for this pre-design study. PARE will report all issues affecting completion of this section (that goes from Depot Street to North Street.) This study will lead to a preliminary cost estimate and concept design. Meetings with MassDOT, abutters, and neighborhood residents will take place over several months during the study process.
